The meeting was called to order by President Anne Brown at 1:55 PM on November 7, 2007 after a presentation on gourds by Bobbie Schenaert.

--Recognition of 2 newly certified Master Gardeners, Rochelle Aymond and Carolyn Nall.

--Treasurer's Report: \$10,131.74 in the bank.

--TMG Awards information is available on the TMG website for anyone interested.

--Will purchase A&M Insect Pest Mgmt CD for the MG Office. Cost is \$8.00.

--Bandera Home & Landscape Show has asked HCMG to participate in their show next Spring.

--Scholarship Committee Report. Fay Drozd outlined the recommendations developed by the committee. After discussion and questions, a motion was made and seconded to accept the committee recommendations with a qualifier that applicants must be a US citizen. A vote was taken with a majority voting to accept the recommendations.

--New officers. Nominations were called for from the floor. None were offered. A motion was made and seconded to accept the nominees as follows: Randy Simmons- President, Roy Eliff - Vice President, Pat Moore – Treasurer and Cheri Bolden – Secretary. The nominees were unanimously elected in a voice vote by those in attendance. Randy Simmons and Pat Moore are now authorized to sign HCMG bank account

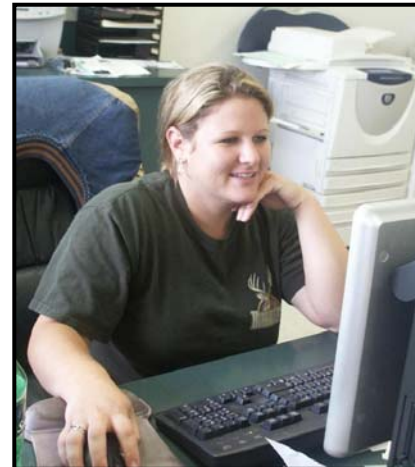
documents and become signatories on the account effective December 1, 2007.
