

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Giant Hyssop</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Agastache barberi</i> "Tutti Frutti"
<b>Other Names</b>	Hummingbird Mint
<b>Description</b>	Raspberry bloom spikes on stiff, purple stems from mid-summer through fall atop fragrant (licorice/anise) leaves. Perfect for cottage gardens, butterfly gardens or sunny walkways.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	2-2.5' tall & 2-2.5'wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Medium. Drought tolerant once established.
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Tolerates many soils but good drainage is a must.
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Deciduous.
<b>Native Status</b>	No
<b>Pollinators</b>	Bees, hummers & butterflies
<b>Care Notes</b>	Dies back in winter. In late winter or early spring, cut stems to the ground before plants break dormancy. Deadhead to encourage blooms. Divide older plants every 3-5 years in spring.
