

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Bulbine, Orange</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Bulbine frutscens</i>
<b>Other Names</b>	Stalked Bulbine, Jelly Burn Plant
<b>Description</b>	Succulent perennial grows in clumps; produces yellow or orange flowers in early summer and again in fall. Spreads through rhizomes; often used as a ground cover.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	1 - 2' tall x 2.5' wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun to part sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Low to medium, drought tolerant once established
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Well drained soil, sandy, rocky, and sandy loam
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Semi-evergreen. Cold tolerant; may not survive temps below 20F
<b>Native Status</b>	Native to Africa
<b>Pollinators</b>	None
<b>Care Notes</b>	Deadhead to encourage repeat blooming.
