

Common Name	Catmint, Walkers Low
Botanical Name	<i>Nepeta raccosa</i>
Other Names	Walkers Low Catmint
Description	Periwinkle blue flower spikes on fragrant mounds of grey green foliage. Blooms with trumpet-shaped flowers April through September. Use in rock gardens, borders herb gardens and naturalized plantings. Cascades over walls. Drought tolerant.
Plant Type	Herbaceous perennial
Plant Size	2 - 2.5' tall x 2.5 – 3' wide
Light Requirements	Full sun to part sun
Water Requirements	Water weekly, more often in extreme heat or if in containers.
Soil Requirements	Dry to medium well-drained soils, shallow rocky soils.
Evergreen or Deciduous	Deciduous/Evergreen
Native Status	Native to Iran, Iraq, and Turkey
Pollinators	Hummingbirds, butterflies, bees
Care Notes	Deadhead to encourage continuous blooming.
