| <b>Description</b>            | Daisy-like flower with orange-yellow center and yellow-gold rays. Stout stems, larger flower and leaves than most tickseeds. Blooms March-July. Attracts butterflies. Self-seeds readily. |

| <b>Plant Size</b>             | 1 - 2' tall x 1.5 – 2' wide   |
| <b>Light Requirements</b>     | Full sun, part sun, part shade  |
| <b>Water Requirements</b>     | Low to medium; drought tolerant   |
| <b>Soil Requirements</b>      | Thrives in poor, well-drained sandy, gravelly or clay soil.   |
| <b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b> | Evergreen   |

| <b>Pollinators</b>            | Butterflies, bees   |
| <b>Care Notes</b>             | Deadhead in summer to encourage continuous blooming. Low maintenance. Naturalizes. No need to fertilize.  |
