

Common Name	Daisy, Copper Canyon
Botanical Name	<i>Tagetes lemmonii</i>
Other Names	Mt. Lemmon's marigold, mountain marigold
Description	Blooms late summer through fall; can flower in late spring. Foliage has a strong aroma. Airy foliage.
Plant Type	Perennial shrub
Plant Size	3' tall x 5' wide
Light Requirements	Full sun, part shade
Water Requirements	Drought-tolerant; suffers if soil is too wet.
Soil Requirements	Can tolerate most well-drained soils.
Evergreen or Deciduous	Deciduous in most winters
Native Status	Native to southern AZ and northern MX
Pollinators	Butterflies, bees
Care Notes	Shear back to the ground in late winter/early spring. Trim lightly in early summer to reinvigorate the plant and blooms. Keep new plant well-watered until established (twice weekly).
