

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Frog Fruit</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Phyla nodiflora var. incisa</i>
<b>Other Names</b>	Texas Frogfruit, Turkey Tangle Frogfruit
<b>Description</b>	Excellent ground cover or growing over boulders or edges of hanging baskets. Petite flowers are white encircling a purple center. Can tolerate drought and flooding; will go dormant in hard winters. Blooms May through October.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	3 – 12” tall x 1 – 2’ wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun to shade
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Low to medium. Fuller with regular water.
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Sand, loam, clay, caliche, limestone. Poor drainage and salty soils okay
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Deciduous to Semi-evergreen. Evergreen in warm years and in areas protected from frost.
<b>Native Status</b>	South
<b>Pollinators</b>	Butterflies. L
<b>Care Notes</b>	Water in dry areas or seasons to maintain a solid cover. Do not mow while blooming, as it can take years to recover.
<b>Texas Superstar</b>	No
