

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Gaura (Pink)</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Oenothera lindheimeri</i>
<b>Other Names</b>	Bee blossom, Clockwood, Wand flower, Indian feather
<b>Description</b>	A very versatile plant with airy masses of deep pink flowers above red tinged green foliage. Compact plant.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	1' tall to 2' wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun, Part sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Low
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Prefers sandy soil, must have good drainage
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Deciduous
<b>Native Status</b>	Edwards Plateau/Hill country
<b>Pollinators</b>	Bees, Butterflies
<b>Care Notes</b>	Cut back in late spring. Add thick layer of mulch in winter. Feeding is not necessary as they grow in poor soil.
