

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Coral Honeysuckle</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Lonicera Sempervirens</i>
<b>Other Names</b>	Woodbine, Trumpet Honeysuckle
<b>Description</b>	High climbing vine with 2-4 clusters of red flowers with yellow insides. Tubular blooms are followed by red berries that finches love. Not aggressive and is good climber or ground cover. The flowers are hummingbird magnets.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	3 – 18' long
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun, part-shade
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Medium
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Can tolerate most soils but prefer rich
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Evergreen
<b>Native Status</b>	East Texas Native
<b>Pollinators</b>	Butterflies, bees
<b>Care Notes</b>	Requires good air circulation/good drainage to prevent powdery mildew. Needs structure to begin climbing.
