

Common Name	Lantana, Texas
Botanical Name	<i>Lantana urticoides</i> or <i>Lantana horrida</i>
Other Names	Calico bush
Description	Flowers begin yellow and turn orange. Blooms summer to fall. High heat tolerance.
Plant Type	Perennial
Plant Size	3 - 5' tall x 4 - 5' wide
Light Requirements	Sun, part sun
Water Requirements	Low
Soil Requirements	Adaptive; best in poor well-drained soil
Evergreen or Deciduous	Deciduous/Evergreen in mild winters
Native Status	Native to Edwards Plateau, Blackland Prairie and Hill Country
Pollinators	Butterflies, bees, birds
Care Notes	Fruit (dark berries) and plants toxic to humans/animals. Can be cut back in late winter/early spring. Prune to shape or to rejuvenate during growing season.
