

Common Name	Fragrant White Mistflower
Botanical Name	<i>Ageratina havanensis</i>
Other Names	Shrubby Boneset, White Shrubby Mistflower, Havana Snakeroot
Description	Open shrub with slender stems reaching up, then arching. Planted in masses, effective as an understory or at the edge of a naturalized setting. Blooms in autumn with masses of fluffy, white, fragrant, cushion-like flower clusters.
Plant Type	Perennial
Plant Size	2 - 6' tall by 2 - 6' wide
Light Requirements	Best in full sun with afternoon shade; part shade.
Water Requirements	Low, but best with occasional water
Soil Requirements	Adapts to most well-drained soils. Alkaline adaptable
Evergreen or Deciduous	Deciduous
Native Status	TX Native
Pollinators	Butterflies, hummingbirds, other nectar-loving insects
Care Notes	Prune heavily in late winter/early spring for a denser plant with heavier bloom
