

Common Name	Nierembergia ‘Starry Eyes’
Botanical Name	<i>Nierembergia gracilis</i>
Other Names	Cup Flower, Dwarf Cup Flower
Description	Beautiful white cup-shaped flowers with lavender centers have buttery yellow eyes at the ends of the stems from early summer to early fall. Well-adapted to growing in containers, which can be protected during the winter.
Plant Type	Perennial (in the lower south of USA and warmer places)
Plant Size	1 - 2' tall x 1 - 2' wide
Light Requirements	Full Sun, Part Sun
Water Requirements	Low
Soil Requirements	Sandy, silt and loamy. Can tolerate most soils with proper drainage.
Evergreen or Deciduous	Evergreen
Native Status	Adapted
Pollinators	Bees, butterflies
Care Notes	Performs well where the heat and humidity are both high.
