

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Plumbago, Blue</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Plumbago auriculata</i>
<b>Other Names</b>	Cape Plumbago, Sky Flower
<b>Description</b>	Shrub produces masses of blue clusters of flowers. Does well in Texas heat. Blooms spring, summer and fall.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	3 – 4' tall x 5' wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun to part sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Drought tolerant, low-medium
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Tolerates a variety of well-drained soil types
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Evergreen (in frost free zones)
<b>Native Status</b>	Adapted
<b>Pollinators</b>	Butterflies and Hummingbirds
<b>Care Notes</b>	Prune to prevent rambling. To encourage re-blooming, dead-head spent flowers.
<b>Texas Superstar</b>	Yes
