

Common Name	Rosemary, Prostrate
Botanical Name	<i>Salvia rosmarinus</i> var. "Prostratus"(synonym: <i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i> var. "Prostratus")
Other Names	Creeping Rosemary, Trailing Rosemary
Description	A dense, groundcover variety of the culinary herb equally suited for retaining walls, rock gardens or spilling out of tall containers. Lavender-to-light blue flowers in the spring & summer. Aromatic foliage is used for seasoning.
Plant Type	Perennial
Plant Size	1' tall x 6' wide
Light Requirements	Full sun
Water Requirements	Low
Soil Requirements	Well drained soil is essential
Evergreen or Deciduous	Evergreen Herb
Native Status	Native to the Mediterranean region
Pollinators	Bees and butterflies
Care Notes	Container grown plants may require more water during summer heat & drought. Responds best to pruning in late winter/early spring before new growth begins.
