

Common Name	Rosemary, Upright
Botanical Name	<i>Salvia rosmarinus</i> (synonym: <i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>)
Other Names	Rosemary
Description	A culinary herb that is an upright shrub with small lavender-to-light blue, spring & summer blooms. Needle-like, strongly scented, grey-green foliage used as flavoring. Mature plants can be shaped as topiary.
Plant Type	Perennial
Plant Size	4' tall x 6' wide
Light Requirements	Full sun
Water Requirements	Low
Soil Requirements	Well drained soil is essential
Evergreen or Deciduous	Evergreen herb
Native Status	Native to the Mediterranean region
Pollinators	Bees and butterflies
Care Notes	Prune as needed after bloom to maintain desired shape and encourage dense foliage. Hardy to approximately 15F with cold protection.
