

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Skullcap, Purple</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Scutellaria wrightii</i>
<b>Other Names</b>	Wright's Purple Skullcap
<b>Description</b>	Produces delightful blue-purple flowers March through July on a low-growing compact plant. Heat and drought tolerant and excellent nectar source for butterflies and bees. Great choice for rock gardens.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	6 - 10" tall x 1' wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun, Part sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Low
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Tolerant of most soils but must have good drainage.
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Evergreen (unless winter extremely harsh)
<b>Native Status</b>	Edwards Plateau & Blackland Prairie
<b>Pollinators</b>	Butterflies, bees
<b>Care Notes</b>	This wonderful plant requires very little care. It may be cut back by 1/2 after it blooms to keep it compact.
