

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Texas Star Hibiscus</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Hibiscus coccineas</i> Walter
<b>Other Names</b>	Scarlet Rosemallow, Crimson Rosemallow, Wild Red Mallow
<b>Description</b>	Stunning foliage and bright red flowers up to 6" wide. Due to size, it makes a great solo feature with late blooming flowers, creating a bright spot when other plants are no longer blooming.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	3 - 6' tall and 2 - 4' wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Moist to wet
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	The soil must be able to hold water.
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Deciduous
<b>Native Status</b>	South
<b>Pollinators</b>	Hummingbirds, butterflies, bees
<b>Care Notes</b>	Carefully place it in the garden so as to not be planted with drought tolerant plants.
