

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Verbena, Moss</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Verbena tenuisecta</i>
<b>Other Names</b>	South American Mock Verbain, Latin American Mock Vervain
<b>Description</b>	Sprawling, fine-textured, fern-like ground cover with a profusion of rich, purple blooms. Appears with its blooms early in spring and stands up to the heat of summer. Low growing so excellent ground cover and in rock gardens.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial
<b>Plant Size</b>	12" tall x 30" wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Full sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Low, Drought tolerant
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Most well-drained soils
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Deciduous in most winters; Semi-evergreen
<b>Native Status</b>	Adapted
<b>Pollinators</b>	Bees, Butterflies, Hummingbirds
<b>Care Notes</b>	Usually freezes to the ground in winter. Shear back to the ground in late winter or early spring. May self-seed.
