

<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Yellow Bells, Sangria</b>
<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Tecoma stans</i> var. <i>angustata</i> 'Sangria'
<b>Other Names</b>	Orange Bells, Orange Trumpet Flower, Esperanza
<b>Description</b>	Heat-loving, full sun shrub with a tropical appearance, producing clusters of showy dark orange trumpet flowers with a wine-colored throat from spring to fall.
<b>Plant Type</b>	Perennial shrub
<b>Plant Size</b>	4 – 6' tall x 4 – 6' wide
<b>Light Requirements</b>	Prefers full sun
<b>Water Requirements</b>	Low to moderate; drought tolerant once established
<b>Soil Requirements</b>	Well-drained, rocky, limestone
<b>Evergreen or Deciduous</b>	Deciduous, but may be evergreen in mild winter
<b>Native Status</b>	South
<b>Pollinators</b>	Bees, Butterflies, Hummingbirds
<b>Care Notes</b>	Remove young seed pods to promote re-blooming; prune in late winter after freeze threats have passed. May develop chlorosis in strongly alkaline soil.
